Brief Biography of Takeshi Utsumi

Dr. Takeshi Utsumi is the Founder and Vice President for Technology & Coordination of Global University System (GUS) and the Chairman of the Global Systems Analysis and Simulation Association in the U.S.A. (GLOSAS/USA). He is the 1994 Laureate of the Lord Perry Award for Excellence in Distance Education. He played a major pioneering role in extending U.S. data communication networks to other countries and deregulating Japanese telecommunication policies to allow the use of Internet for e-mail, triggering the de-monopolization and privatization of the Japanese telecommunications industry and beginning a movement emulated in many other countries, so that today there are over 1.7 billion email users around the world. He conducted innovative distance teaching trials with "Global Lecture Hall (GLH)" videoconferences using hybrid delivery technologies which spanned the globe; he continues to lecture, consult, and do research in process control, management science, systems science and engineering at the University of Michigan, the University of Pennsylvania, M.I.T. and many other universities, government agencies, and large firms in Japan and other countries.
