Preamble:

OUPAC is the flagship event of the Oxford University Africa Society (OUAS), an organization focused on African affairs at Oxford University. OUAS seeks to set the agenda for the future of the continent by providing a platform for African students and others to engage with opportunities and developments in Africa. The Society has been in existence for over 50 years and first launched this annual Conference three years ago, and it has already become one of the largest gatherings of African students in the United Kingdom.

Conference Overview

The 2013 OUPAC will bring together hundreds of dynamic scholars, entrepreneurs, activists, and political leaders from around the world. Focusing on issues such as governance, technological advancement, sustainable development and healthcare innovation, it aims to showcase Africa's development and investment potential.
